1. **Exhibit A** is a sample Disclaimer form to be signed by a nonmember spouse to disclaim any interest in the membership interest of the member spouse so that the member spouse has sole ownership of the interest as separate property.

Introduction

Section 1.01 Overview of the Quick Start Guide

I have formed over 1,000 Arizona limited liability companies since 2001. I advertise on my website at www.keytlaw.com that I do not charge for questions about forming and operating Arizona limited liability companies. In talking to people and answering thousands of questions about Arizona LLCs, I found that people ask the same questions over and over. This Quick Start Guide contains answers to the most commonly asked questions about forming and operating Arizona limited liability companies.

I wrote this Quick Start Guide for two reasons:

1. To tell you important facts you need to know about operating your Arizona limited liability company, and
2. To reduce the amount of time I have to spend answering questions over the phone.

Reason number two may be selfish on my part, but do not forget reason one. If you have a question about operating an Arizona LLC (but not tax-related questions – see your CPA for the answers to tax questions), the answer is probably in this Quick Start Guide. If you have a question about Arizona LLCs that is not answered in this QSG, call me, but before you do, please read the Quick Start Guide carefully and make sure the answer is not in it.

Section 1.02 Arizona LLC Law

This information contained in this Quick Start Guide applies only to Arizona limited liability companies that operate in Arizona. All fifty states in the United States have laws that allow for the creation of LLCs within each state, but each state has its own unique LLC laws. Some LLC laws of states other than Arizona may be the same as Arizona LLC laws, but you should never assume that is the case.

If your LLC engages in activity outside of Arizona, it must comply with the laws of each jurisdiction where it engages in activity. The application of the laws of another state
